

CHAMPIONS AND CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

A dog awarded Winners at a Conformation show shall be credited with a number of Championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of Championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be as provided hereunder:

*Dogs Competing	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 & more
Points Allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5

**includes the dog awarded Winners*

All dogs defeated, either directly or indirectly up to the Breed level, are to be including in the count. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall be included in the calculation for championship points. In addition, points are awarded to a dog awarded Winners which also places in the regular Group competition:

A class dog awarded Best in Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with the five (5) points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five (5) points at a single show. In order for a dog to be issued a CKC Championship Certificate the dog must: earn at least 10 Championship points under at least 3 (three) different judges, be individually registered in the records of the CKC or have an Event Registration Number, and have earned at least one 2 (two) point win at the breed or group level.

I (we) agree that the Northern Alberta Canine Association has the right to refuse this entry for just cause, which the Club shall deem to be sufficient. In consideration of the acceptance of entries made in these all-breed shows, obedience trials, agility trials or any of the associated Specialties, and of the holding of these shows and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prize money, ribbons or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the Northern Alberta Canine Association and associated Specialty Clubs, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents, or show secretaries, and the owner or lessor of the premises and any employees of the aforementioned parties, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of a dog while in or upon the show premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss of a dog by disappearance, theft, death or otherwise, and from any claim for damage or injury to the dog, whether such loss, disappearance, theft, damage or injury be caused or alleged to be caused by the negligence of the Club(s) or any of the parties aforementioned, or by the negligence of any other person, or any other cause or causes.

1. Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times on the show grounds or within the show building.

4. All recreational units must have buckets underneath for their drains. Those discharging of any water on the grounds will be removed by order of the health department and subject to a fine.
5. A judge officiating at this show held under CKC rules shall not be subjected to any indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. (4.1.3)
6. A show-giving club will be held responsible during the show for the conduct of exhibitors and spectators. Any person acting in an abusive or objectionable manner must be removed from the show on complaint to the Show Superintendent (1.4)
7. There is to be NO SMOKING in the large show tent, nor entrances to it, and NO SMOKING is allowed in the show building.
8. Dogs must be on the show grounds 1 hour prior to judging of their breed.
9. All vehicles are left on the show grounds at your own risk. No security is provided.
10. No abuse of parking personnel, NACA members or volunteers will be tolerated!!
11. RV's will not be allowed to travel on the show grounds when judging is occurring. Under special circumstances (in case of emergency) the show superintendent will stop the show and parking personnel will assist in the safe removal of vehicle.

Introducing Our Judges

DIANE BAILLEY – is licensed by the Australian National Kennel Council as an all-breed judge. Her first pure-bred dog was a Pembroke Welsh Corgi bitch – a birthday gift from her husband in 1962. After preliminary experience in the obedience ring she became not only her first Australian show Champion but also the foundation bitch of a long line of over 100 “DYGAE” Pembroke Champions.

Her homebred Pembroke have since won many top awards, including Best Exhibit in Show all-breeds Melbourne Royal 1987, over a record entry. Grand champion Dygae Wildside was Australia’s first Grand Champion of the Breed and Best in Show at the 7th National Corgi Specialty, while Best Exhibit at the 10th National was Grand Champion Dygae Tallulah Belle. Grand Champion Dygae Di Caprio has continued the tradition winning the Dog Challenge at the 11th National in May 2004. Mrs. Baillie has also bred and exhibited 6 Champion “DYGAE” Cardigan Welsh Corgis and has handled successfully Papillons, Fox Terriers, Cairn Terriers, Afghan Hounds, Whippets and Shetland Sheepdogs.

Whenever possible she assists with her Judges Education and Training Programmes and she judges regularly at all-breed Championship shows throughout Australia and New Zealand. She has judged Pembroke Specialties on four separate occasions in the USA where she has also awarded CC’s to Cardigan Welsh Corgis. In May 2000 she also adjudicated for the Finnish Corgi Club at their Annual Specialty Show, subsequently judging various breeds again in Finland (FCI system) in 2002 and 2003 including Best Exhibit in Show all-breeds. She has also been privileged to judge The Pembroke Welsh Corgi Club of Nagano Specialty in Japan in 2001. International appointments during 2005 included Natal Coast Kennel Club (Terriers), Natal Working & Herding Breeds Association (Herding) and Afghan Hounds for Highway Kennel Club in South Africa.

She is vice-president of the Welsh Corgi club of Victoria, and is also a Life Member of The Welsh Corgi League (England) and a member of the Pembroke Welsh Corgi Club of America.

In her professional life Diane Baillie is a part-time Hospital Pharmacist specifically in Aged, Rehabilitation and Palliative Care. (*Mrs. Baillie is also judging the Welsh and Cardigan Corgi Specialties, Australian Cattle Dogs and Bouvier des Flandres specialties at this show.*)

SYLVIA BARKEY – ... has been breeding Staffordshire Bull Terriers under the Rolona prefix since 1976. She has bred the most titled Staffordshire in the world and in the last decade has made the top ten terrier list twice with her exhibits. Sylvia also bred Toy Poodles for ten years and enjoyed the challenges they presented.

She and her husband Dan operate an extensive equine business in Ontario, supplying specialty horses to children’s camps and riding establishments. As well, they have a large cow-calf herd and grow their own legumes and grain for both horses and cattle.

In her spare time Sylvia tends to her perennial gardens, fussing over her roses and enjoys cooking and entertaining the ‘multitudes’ that arrive for evenings of fun and lively entertainment.

She is adamant that exhibitors be treated courteously and with respect and enjoys working with new exhibitors, noting that they will be the future of dog breeding in Canada and that they must be encouraged, for the good of us all.

EUGENE BLAKE – I started working with dogs in 1954 as a dog bather at a French Poodle Shop in Houston, Texas. I attended my first dog show in 1955 and then decided I wanted to show dogs.

I became an all-breed licensed handler in 1968. I showed dogs professionally for some 33 years, then, I retired and became a judge. During that time I bred Poodles, Cocker Spaniels, Italian Greyhounds, Maltese, Yorkshire Terriers, Salukis, and Afghan Hounds. I never bred more than 4 litters of any of one breed. As a handler I helped many of my clients with their breeding programs, including choosing studs, and picking puppies.

I started judging in 1990, with the Hound Group. Since that time I have added the Sporting Group, Toy Group, and Non-Sporting Group. I judge 4 Groups, Best in Show, Junior Showmanship, and Miscellaneous. I have judged in Australia, Canada, Finland, Indonesia, Japan, New Zealand, Sweden, Taiwan, and Thailand. As of now, I judge between 60 and 70 shows a year.

Thank you for inviting me to judge your show.

KAREN BREARLEY – I took my first obedience class with a Golden Retriever named Brew but never showed him. It wasn’t until our first Tervuren in 1993 that I was introduced into the world of competitive Obedience. My Tervurens and Pomeranians have brought home High in Class and High in Trial wins. We also compete in Conformation, Herding and Rally. Our newest addition is a Sheltie who finished her Championship and earned a Rally and Herding title all before a year of age. More recently, she has finished her 2nd herding title and her American CD with some lovely scores. I am certified to judge in all levels of Obedience as well as Rally and am a CGN Evaluator. I volunteer as an instructor for the Junior Kennel Club

and also as an evaluator for the St. John's Pet Therapy Program. "Ember" is a member of a K9 Vaudeville act who performs and visits in care homes and hospitals. I love that my dogs can make people smile. (Ms. Brearley is also judging the Bouvier des Flandres National Obedience Trial at this show & the Australian Cattle Dog National Sweepstakes.)

R. TERRY GAINS – I started in Labrador Retrievers when I was 13 (50 years ago), first in Obedience and then showing in Conformation. I am a lifetime member of the Greater Victoria Dog Obedience Training Club and have been judging Obedience for 15 years. For the past 7 years I have been judging Conformation and am licensed in Sporting and Toys. My wife Vicky and I have bred Labradors under the "Gainspride" prefix for 35 years and have had Best in Show and Best in Specialty Show winners. I am a member of the Vancouver Island Dog Judges Group and a member of the Canadian Dog Judges Association. (Mr. Gains is also judging the Labrador Retriever Club of Canada Obedience Trial at this show.)

NANCY HOWARD – Nancy has been involved in the sport of dog obedience for over 20 years and has been totally hooked on Rally Obedience since the sport was introduced. She has instructed hundreds of students over the years and is very excited to add Rally O to her teaching program.

Nancy purchased her first dog, a Sheltie, in the early 80's and since then has trained Shetland Sheepdogs, Bouviers, Soft Coated Wheaten Terriers and Australian Shepherds in Obedience, Conformation and Rally Obedience. They have all taught her something different and she wouldn't change those training experiences for anything.

She is an avid Rally Obedience competitor and you will see her out with her Sheltie "Odie" every chance she gets. Nancy looks forward to her journey as a Rally Obedience judge and making Rally Obedience an enjoyable and fun experience for both you and your dog.

PEGGY OTERO – I was born in Caracas, Venezuela, in a very dog-loving family, although at the time my parents did not envision the influence dogs would have on our lives. My twin and only sister Conny and I competed successfully in junior handling and started getting heavily involved in the dog sport while we grew up. At the time, our parents bred American Cocker Spaniels and Wire-haired Fox Terriers, adding a Dalmatian bitch as a reward when we finished Elementary school, as we were very good students. That was the best gift a kid could receive.

Having a Mexican father, we moved from Venezuela to Mexico because the unstable political situation in the country made our academic future uncertain. There were few universities at the time and these were almost always closed because of strikes. After a couple of years at a boarding school in USA, we came to live permanently in Mexico, adopting its nationality. We started breeding at the beginning of the 70's, starting with Basset Hounds until the late 90's. At present I still have two old Basset Hounds and four Miniature Wire-haired Dachshunds, my new breed for the future.

I obtained my degree in Architecture from the Mexican University and worked in design and construction for many years, always combining it with my love for the dog sport. During the last 24 Years I worked at a government-owned bank in the Appraisal Department. I retired almost two years ago, which allows me to travel and judge around the world without remorse. I have been a member of the Mexican Kennel Club (FCM) since our arrival in Mexico in 1962. I was president of the Basset Hound Club of Mexico for several years during the 80's.

I was part of the judging panel of the FCI World Show in Mexico in 1999; I have also judged in the United States, Canada, Mexico, Guatemala, El Salvador, Honduras, Costa Rica, Colombia, Venezuela, Ecuador, Peru, Brazil, Uruguay, Chile and Argentina, as well as twice in Australia's prestigious Melbourne Royal, Sydney, Japan, South Africa, Thailand and New Zealand.

LARRY & JANET SINCLAIR – in 1961 we purchased a pet Boxer. This led to becoming members of the Spokane Boxer Club where a member offered us a show quality Boxer female on a co-ownership. This Boxer became the foundation of our breeding program. We owner-handled many to their championships.

In the seventies Larry was licensed by the American Kennel Club as an all-breed Professional Handler. He professionally handled dogs in all seven groups concentrating on shows in the United States and several circuits in Canada. Dog showing was a family affair with both our daughter and son working for us. Our daughter, Shelli Sinclair-Wood, continued in the sport of dogs through professional handling and now as a judge. Besides being involved with breeding and showing, Janet was a Kindergarten teacher.

We retired from professional handling in 1998. The natural progression for us was to apply for judging. We have judged at all-breed shows across the United States as well as shows in other countries. We were both selected by the membership of the American Boxer Club to judge their National Specialty. (Mr. Sinclair is also judging the Akita Club of Alberta Specialty at this show.)

THOMAS JOHN TOUZEL – I was born in Fort Worth, Texas of Canadian parents. I bred my first (and only) litter of pure-bred Miniature Schnauzers in 1956. I returned to Canada to attend school and began attending conformation shows. I studied in New York as an Interior Designer and worked in New York and Washington, DC.

After 20 years in that business I bought a kennel in Canada and began breeding Shih Tzu's and Setters. I bred all three setters but primarily concentrated on the Gordon Setters. I produced and finished many champions in all of those breeds and operated a boarding and grooming kennel with a capacity of 300 dogs.

I started judging in 1983 and realized that it was a passion that would remain close to my heart forever. I have judged in Canada, USA, Russia, Puerto Rico, Colombia, Korea, South Africa, Spain, Buenos Aires, Thailand, China and Finland. Over the years of judging I have also realized that none of us "know it all" ... although we certainly "know" the Standards of all the dogs, we are constantly learning the nuances and developing an understanding of *current fashion* and realizing that the original purpose of these animals is paramount in their breeding. Balancing these criteria is the hardest part of judging.

Looking forward to judging for a good long while ...

GRANT TOWNSEND – My involvement in the dog world began with the showing of Shetland Sheepdogs in the early 1980's. The Shelties were shown in both the Conformation and the Obedience rings. My first toy dog was a Papillon. "Bethanie" had such a contagious personality that, over the next few years, my house grew to accommodate many more of these lovely dogs. I also showed my Paps in both Conformation and Obedience. I was given a lovely Yorkshire Terrier in the early 90's and began showing both toy breeds for the next few years. Currently I co-own a Cavalier King Charles Spaniel with a friend in British Columbia.

I am a life-member of the Edmonton Kennel Club and a past president and treasurer of the Toy Dog Club of Edmonton. I began my judging career in 2002 and I am licensed for the Sporting, Toy and Herding Groups and half of the Working Group.

This sport has given me the privilege of having so many wonderful dogs in my life and also has allowed me to develop many wonderful friendships. My non-dog world career is as a high school teacher.

CINDY VOGELS – Cindy began showing Soft Coated Wheaten Terriers with her mother (Jackie Gottlieb) in 1968. CONFORMATION

The following CKC conformation classes (divided by sex) will be offered:

Junior Puppy: for dogs 6 mths of age but under 9 mths of age.

Senior Puppy: for dogs 9 mths of age but under 12 mths of age

12-18 Months: for dogs 12 mths of age and under 18 mths of age

Canadian Bred: for dogs born in Canada; champions in any country excluded.

Bred by Exhibitor: for dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder.

Open: for all dogs.

Specials Only: dogs which are registered individually in the records of the Canadian Kennel Club and have attained championship status may be entered in the 'Specials Only' class. Exhibition Only: for all dogs over 6 mths of age and eligible for registration with the CKC (non-competitive class).

OBEDIENCE

Pre-Novice: for any pure bred dog that has not earned the title PCD (Pre Companion Dog) title in

Canada. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A dog may be entered in this class that has not earned the title of CD in Canada or US.

Novice A: for any purebred dog that has not won the title of CD. Only one dog may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is not eligible for this class.

Novice B: for any purebred dog that has not won the title of CD in CANADA. Dogs in this class may be handled by any person. More than one dog may be entered by any handler, but each dog must have a separate handler for the 'sit' and 'down' exercise. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is eligible for this class.

Novice C: for any purebred dog that has gained a CD, CDX, UD or any other advanced title and exercises will be performed and judged as described in the official Novice classes. Scores earned in Novice C are not eligible for High in Trial. This is an elective class and offered for those people who feel the dog requires ring experience. Dogs may be entered in Novice C class in addition to any of the Official Classes or Unofficial classes.

Open A: for any purebred dog that has won the title of CD but has not won the title of CDX. Only one dog may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is not eligible for entry in this class.

Open B: for any purebred dog that has won the title of CD, CDX or UD in CANADA. Dogs in this class may be handled by any person. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is eligible for this class. A dog may be entered in both Open A and Open B at any one trial. A dog eligible for UD is also eligible for entry in this class at the same trial.

Utility: for any purebred dog that has won the title of CDX in CANADA. Handlers may enter more than one dog in this class, but each dog must have a separate handler for the 'group examination' exercise.

RALLY

Rally Novice A: Dogs entered in this class may not have won a CKC Rally Novice title or any CKC Novice Obedience title.


Rally Novice B: Any dog may compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced Class is earned. No dog may be entered in Rally Novice A and Rally Novice B at any one trial.

Rally Advanced A: For dogs that have won the Rally Novice title but have not won the Rally Advanced title or any CKC Novice Obedience title.

Rally Advanced B: for dogs that have won the Rally Novice title. No dog may be entered in both Rally Advanced A and Rally Advanced B at any one trial.

Rally Excellent A: for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced title but have not won the Rally Excellent title or any CKC Novice Obedience title.

Rally Excellent B: for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced title. No dog may be entered in the Rally Excellent A and Rally Excellent B class at any one trial.
