

**C.K.C. Canine Good Neighbour Test**  
**At this show you can add a CGN title to your dog's name!**

“This CKC program identifies and rewards responsible and caring owners and their canine partners! The purpose of the CGN program test is to ensure that our dogs are accepted as valued members of the community and can be counted on to present good manners at home, in public places and in the presence of other dogs. The program was created to assist canine owners in combating anti-dog sentiment and to enhance community awareness of responsible dog ownership and the benefits associated with dog ownership.” (Taken from the Canine Good Neighbour Program Participant Handbook, available from the CKC by calling the order desk at 416-675-5511 or www.ckc.ca)

This test is not a competition calling for precision performance by the handler and dog. Rather, it assesses the handler and dog's relationship together with the handler's ability to control the dog. We recommend that you read the CGN Participant Handbook so that you will be familiar with what you and your dog will be required to do.

ENTRY FEES: \$25.00 per dog (this includes a \$5.00 CKC fee for CGN Certification)  
 (Entries at this pre-entry price of \$25.00 will close May 5, 2009. If space available, some entries will be taken after this date or at the show for a fee of \$35.00 per dog.)

Dogs will be tested in order that their entries are received, however flexibility in scheduling will be made for those showing in the Friday Conformation, Agility or Rally rings. **THOMAS JOHN TOUZEL** – I was born in Fort Worth, Texas of Canadian parents. I bred my first (and only) litter of pure-bred Miniature Schnauzers in 1956. I returned to Canada to attend school and began attending conformation shows. I studied in New York as an Interior Designer and worked in New York and Washington, DC.

After 20 years in that business I bought a kennel in Canada and began breeding Shih Tzu's and Setters. I bred all three setters but primarily concentrated on the Gordon Setters. I produced and finished many champions in all of those breeds and operated a boarding and grooming kennel with a capacity of 300 dogs.

I started judging in 1983 and realized that it was a passion that would remain close to my heart forever. I have judged in Canada, USA, Russia, Puerto Rico, Colombia, Korea, South Africa, Spain, Buenos Aires, Thailand, China and Finland. Over the years of judging I have also realized that none of us “know it all” ... although we certainly “know” the Standards of all the dogs, we are constantly learning the nuances and developing an understanding of *current fashion* and realizing that the original purpose of these animals is paramount in their breeding. Balancing these criteria is the hardest part of judging.

I truly enjoy judging and enjoy the sportsman-like spirit in the ring. Showing dogs must be fun for the dogs, fun for the exhibitor, fun for the crowd at ringside, and yes ... it must be fun for the judge. When any one of these requirements is not met it is time for a re-evaluation. My only demand is that you bring me happy dogs and that you arrive with a smile on your face. Looking forward to judging for a good long while ...

**GRANT TOWNSEND** – My involvement in the dog world began with the showing of Shetland Sheepdogs in the early 1980's. The Shelties were shown in both the Conformation and the Obedience rings. My first toy dog was a Papillon. “Bethanie” had such a contagious personality that, over the next few years, my house grew to accommodate many more of these lovely dogs. I also showed my Paps in both Conformation and Obedience. I was given a lovely Yorkshire Terrier in the early 90's and began showing both toy breeds for the next few years. Currently I co-own a Cavalier King Charles Spaniel with a friend in British Columbia.

I am a life-member of the Edmonton Kennel Club and a past president and treasurer of the Toy Dog Club of Edmonton. I began my judging career in 2002 and I am licensed for the Sporting, Toy and Herding Groups and half of the Working Group.

This sport has given me the privilege of having so many wonderful dogs in my life and also has allowed me to develop many wonderful friendships. My non-dog world career is as a high school teacher.

**CINDY VOGELS** – Cindy began showing Soft Coated Wheaten Terriers with her mother (Jackie Gottlieb) in 1968. Under the Andover prefix, they have bred well over 100 American Champions including multiple specialty, group and Best in Show winners. In addition, they have bred champions in Canada, the UK and Scandinavia, and have produced many top producers including the top producing US Terrier dam of all time.

Cindy has also bred Kerry Blue, Welsh and Norfolk Terriers, Brittanys and Greyhounds. Present housedogs include Greyhounds, Pekingese, a Japanese Chin, and a Brittany.

Chairman of the AKC Canine Health Foundation, Cindy is a past president of the Soft Coated Wheaten Terrier Club of America, and had served as their AKC Delegate. She is now Show Chairman for Evergreen Colorado Kennel Club and a member of the Board of Trustees for “Take the Lead.”

Currently approved to judge the Terrier group, the Sporting group, 11 Toy Breeds, Best in Show, and Junior Showmanship, Cindy has judged a number of national and many regional specialties in the US, the AKC Eukanuba National Championship, and the Montgomery County KC. She has also judged in Australia, Sweden, Italy, Finland and China.

Cindy has written an award-winning column for the AKC's monthly magazine “The Gazette” (Better Breeding) and has had a number of feature articles published by the Gazette.

A graduate of New England conservatory of Music with a performance degree in Flute, she holds a Master of Music degree in history from the University of Colorado. Cindy has been married to David for 33 years and they have one married son. A native of metropolitan New York, the Vogels have lived in the Denver area for more than 30 years where they raise and show champion Morgan horses under the Andover prefix. Cindy also enjoys a wide variety of sports including running (completed 7 marathons), cycling, swimming and skiing.
